The Rt Hon Sir Julian Flaux is a Lord Justice of Appeal, appointed in December 2016. Since November 2019 he has been Lead Judge for International Relations, and as of February 2020 is the Supervising Lord Justice of the Commercial Court.

Called to the Bar in 1978, he practised at the Commercial Bar from 1979 to 2007 specialising in disputes involving insurance and reinsurance, shipping, international trade and professional negligence, and was appointed QC in 1994. He was appointed a High Court Judge in May 2007. He was successively from 2010 until 2016 Presiding Judge of the Midland Circuit, Judge in Charge of the Commercial Court, and President of the Special Immigration Appeals Commission.
